## Maui Real Estate Update

Maui County residential real estate sales numbers and prices were steady at the end of the first quarter of 2008. The market has definitely had a cooling period but nothing like on the mainland.

Prices for single-family homes are down 9 percent for the first half of this year, but prices for condominiums are up that much or more, according to statistics compiled by the Realtors Association of Maui.

The number of closed residential sales is down sharply, but the pace of sales - as measured by days on the market - has slowed only moderately.

The condominium market presents a much different picture. The number of units turning over is half what it was three years ago - 507 in the first half this year. But prices are much higher.

The median condo price is up 10 percent this year to \$575,000, and the average is up 27 percent to \$961,554 - which means condos are averaging more than homes, a unique situation for Maui.

As far as prices go, the peak of the market was not three years ago but is happening right now. In mid-2005, the median condo was selling for \$371,500, and the average was \$514,895. Today's median is \$60,000 above 2005's average.

As would be expected with the pace of the market slowing so much, the days on market for condos is way up.

In early 2005, the monthly average days on market ranged from 102 to 140 for condos. This year, 2005's days-on-market ceiling became 2008's floor. The number ranged from 140 days in May to 223 in January.

The year started off with the County Council suddenly deciding to crack down on Transient Vacation Rentals in residential and agricultural zoned areas there by ignoring past administration policies and causing financial hardships on many local residents and B&B's. In addition the DLNR (Department of Land and Natural Resources) decides to suddenly start enforcing the requirement for all Weddings held on state beaches to get a permit, however apparently there was a law suit in 2001 that settled that issue and permits are not required...now that the DLNR started a panic they are looking for clarification claiming they weren't aware of that they lost that suit even though they paid restitution and attorney fees. And for the latest addition to chasing people elsewhere is the recent decision by The Maui County Cultural Resources Commission to deny permits for the Lahaina Town Action Committee to conduct its annual Halloween program in Lahaina, which by the way had about 30k attendees last year...They claim that since Lahaina is a designated state and national historic district, somehow this one night a year is destroying that cultural image...Is it just me or do County officials appear to be working overtime to kill the Maui economy???

## **Honua'ula is under fire again...**

Just when things seemed to be moving forward again another glitch hit this development. Apparently the council acted prematurely granting permits for the project to move forward, the vote to approve zoning for the project was 5-4. # Miscellaneous Maui News

**MAALAEA...**Kaheawa Wind Farm selected for U.S. wind technology research.. Maui's Wind Farm will become the first partner in a program by the U.S. Department of Energy's National Renewable Energy Laboratory to research wind technology. No details have been released but UPC Wind which operates the turbines mentioned using the batteries to store power during off peak

## Annual Great Whale Count sets a new record!

A record 1,726 whales were tallied in the annual Great Whale Count. The North Pacific humpback whale population has been increasing during recent years at a rate of about 7 percent. The counting is done from a number of locations over a three hour period. The stations stretch from the Ritz-Carlton, Kapalua on the west side to Puu Olai in Makena.

**Downhill tours looking up...**A recent federal study shows that two downhill bicycle companies Maui Downhill and Cruiser Phil's Volcano Riders have had low accident rates at Haleakala Nation Park. Currently the bike companies have had to start outside the park due to a temporary standdown by Park officials due to a fatal crash in September.

**Water rates** will increase by \$2.75 a month for the average residential family, with larger increases for those who use larger volumes of water.

**Sewer rates** will increase up to \$3.80 a month for a single family resident.




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## LaughParade®
