Maui Real Estate Update

MAUI Real Estate market mixed bag in 2007: Contrary to what is happening on the mainland, Maui's 2007 Real Estate Market finished just about even. Average condominium prices rose 4 percent to \$817,000, while average single-family home prices fell 1 percent to \$921,000. That said it seems that overall in my opinion Maui prices are down 10 to 15% compared to 25% or more on the mainland. We are starting to see more short sales popping up subject to bank approval. One large factor on Maui seems to be the shortage of housing in general. For instance if a house is listed at \$500,000 for a short sale there are multiple offers at prices over the asking price, whereas on the mainland you could probably snag a deal for less than the listed price, that doesn't seem to be happening here. One thing is certain now is a great time to buy, interest rates are down and there are deals to be had, not necessarily steals but very good deals.

Maalaea News & Tid Bits...

Maalaea Harbor will be receiving a much needed \$19 million dollar face lift, bids will be going out in June 2008, construction is slated for December 2008 and take approximately 18 to 24 months to complete. **Kealia Boardwalk** is ready but the parking isn't. I sometimes wonder why these things are not checked out early on, they have been waiting 2 years for a special state permit, this will allow 12 stalls for cars, 2 stalls for handicap-accessible and 2 spaces for buses...maybe this year but I am hot holding my breath. They put an entire sidewalk in Maalaea in less than 6 months, unbelievable. **The \$400 million Maalaea Mauka's** project has their EIS (environment impact study) ready for review. This is the proposed 949 unit residential community across the street from Carl's Jr. will cover 257 acres, be a mix of single and multifamily homes, townhouses, rental apartments and affordable housing for seniors. 
Wailea-Makena News & Tid Bits

Honua'ula (formerly known as Wailea 670) is still a Hot Topic these days, creating a major stir among residents both for and against the development. Maui Tomorrow is calling for a Wailea 670 supplemental EIS, apparently they have been asking for 2 years but the County Council has yet to address it. The council Land Use Committee voted in November 6-2 to recommend approval of the zoning with a list of conditions a mile long. Maui Miscellaneous

New entrance to Maui planned...The \$72 Million airport access road is undergoing its last stages of the environmental assessment, the design could be finished by January 09...currently once you arrive at Kahului airport you exit through a tree shaded Keolani Place onto Dairy road that is a visual eye sore of Maui's three big box stores on the way to your accommodations. First impressions being what they are the Department of Transportation is planning a new access road detouring around the current route through a visually appealing gateway thus starting your vacation with a better impression and overall satisfaction. Due in 2011-2012.

Maui Memorial upgrade...recently a panel charged with "identifying the county's current and future health care needs voted to recommend Maui Memorial Medical Center be modernized"...Hello have these people been living under a rock, are they just now seeing the light. On the bright side they are actually moving forward with a Heli-pad for MMMC (Maui Memorial Medical Center) To say this has been needed for years is an understatement, that said the 20 foot high 60 by 60 foot helipad will be located 100 feet from the emergency room, could actually be under construction by June and completed in 6 to 8 months. That would be a miracle.



Disney is planning a resort hotel on Oahu, this will be there first resort without a nearby theme park, the hotel will focus on family-centered vacations while featuring Hawaii's culture.

Wailea leads Maui in room revenues, Wailea's resorts are getting more money than resorts anywhere else estimating revenue per available room at \$307.92, amazing. **The Sea Watch** has introduced a new menu, featuring the famous Masi winery from Veneto Italy topping the list with their flagship wine, Amarone. Another new restaurant is replacing the Hula Moons in the Wailea Beach Mariott Resort & Spa...Just opened by a slew of A-list celebrity investors is **Mala Wailea** check out this list...Alice Cooper (Rocker) NBA Golden State Warriors coach Don Nelson, William Morris Agency Chairman Jim Wiatt, A&M Records co-founder Jerry Moss (his horse won the Kentucky Derby) just to name a few, offering a Mediterranean menu featuring Breakfast and Dinner...no lunch.

Makena-DLNR plans to close Ahihi-Kinau for 2 years to preserve the ecosystems of anchialine pools and lava tubes. This would prevent further damage to the natural area and allow for recovery of the heavily visited area.

Hawaii Superferry: Update...After all of the hullabaloo over the Superferry it is still not running on a regular schedule. Once they got the government to step in and get compromises between the parties, then got the go ahead to set sail, we had the December storms and wave surges plus damage to the docking barge in Kahului which kept the Alakai out of service. Now the weather has cleared and just when they can get going again they put the Alakai in dry dock for repairs to the rudder system...current sailing date March 3rd. If it wasn't for bad luck they would have no luck at all.

Go! Airline...the latest A US Bankruptcy judge ordered them to pay Hawaiian \$80 million in damages for unfairly using the information obtained during the time Hawaiian was looking for investors to drive Hawaiian out of business. I was glad because I felt that was Go's! Intention all along was to put both Hawaiian and Aloha out of business, then we would be stuck with one airline and the interisland flight prices would go sky high.


