Restaurants Near The Airport

Wow! If you have ever tried to eat near the airport you have found yourself with a tough task. Over the years some places have proved to be a safe bet but we are always looking for something new. Even harder is finding a good place close by to take a client to lunch. There are some hidden gems around if you know where to look.

L'Elegant Gourmet has just opened behind Jalopy Joes on 441 at Jones Ave. Unlimited by its name, this gal can cook a "down home" meal with the best while offering gourmet items to boot. The owner, Della, has been offering catering service for corporate aviation for years, proving herself to many of us with her high quality food. There is a great selection of sandwiches and salads. The most expensive meal is \$5.75! Call ahead and it will be ready for you (407-375-8280). This is a wonderful addition to our lunch landscape, please support this new restaurant!

For your next quick lunch try **La Fiesta** located in the Winn Dixie plaza on 441. They offer a Mexican buffet or you can order off of the menu. This is the second location for this family owned restaurant. The buffet is simple but good and you can carry on a conversation. The lunch buffet costs \$5.99. You will probably have to ask for chips and salsa, I don't know why it doesn't just hit the table like most Mexican places, but its not too big of an inconvenience for an otherwise good value.

For a business lunch, head for The Captain & the Cowboy. It is located at the split of 441 and 436 on the south side. This week we had lunch with clients here and they were all impressed by the atmosphere and food. Again this is a place where you can carry on a conversation without yelling, the parking is ample and the menu has a good selection. Lunch will be at a slower pace and cost a little more than average. When you leave head out the rear of the parking lot if you need to turn left; the 441 exit is right turn only and watch for the peacocks that roam the grounds!
