

Northeast Portland real estate options consist of single-family homes for sale, condominiums, townhouses, and land. Portland is different from other cities of its size because it offers an extensive park system, strong sense of community pride, eclectic tastes, excellent mass transit options and a pedestrian and bicycle-friendly layout.
